CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD during the Mass at 11.30 am

From Sunday 11 September the Children's Liturgy of the Word will re-commence, following a break during the pandemic. It is not a creche or other child-minding service, but an integral part of the Sunday Mass, celebrated in a way that is better suited to children. The Liturgy is for those who have not started preparation for First Holy Communion and the minimum age is 2 years. Any child who is not at school must be accompanied by an adult (aged 18+). THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR THIS WEEK . . .

Monday is the **Memorial of the Beheading of St John the Baptist** - the horrific drama of his death, on the orders of the weak yet powerful Herod, is told in the gospel of today's liturgy. There are a number of churches dedicated to this feast, including the Anglican church at Doddington in Kent. Telephoning the vicarage there must be somewhat alarming: "*Beheading of John the Baptist, may I help you?*"

Tuesday is the **Memorial of SS Margaret Clitherow, Anne Line and Margaret Ward** -- three of the many women martyrs of the Reformation. **Margaret Clitherow** was born at York in 1536; she converted to Catholicism, for which she was imprisoned for two years. Upon release, she sheltered priests in her home. Arrested again, she was condemned to the horrible penalty of being slowly pressed to death. She died at York in 1586. **Anne Line** was born at Dunmow in Essex. A convert, she was hanged at Tyburn in 1601 for harbouring priests. We have a window in her honour in our church, a gift of the Catholic Women's League. **Margaret Ward** was hanged at Tyburn in 1588 for the crime of rescuing a priest.

Wednesday is the **Memorial of St Aidan and the Saints of Lindisfarne** -- a saintly bishop who established Holy Island as a missionary base for preaching the gospel in northern England. Aidan died in 651. His monastery became a powerhouse of prayer and faith, producing many saints of the north including St Cuthbert.

Thursday is the **Diocesan Memorial of St Sebbi, King of the East Saxons** -- after thirty peaceful years as king, he received the monastic habit at London, died shortly afterwards and was buried in Old St Paul's.

THE PARABLES OF LUKE

A Gidea Park Faith Talk on the Parables of Luke will be broadcast by live stream on Wednesday 21st September from 7 pm. Our distinguished speaker is Deacon Sean Loone, well-known in the diocese of Birmingham for his work in education and in evangelisation. Sean will speak about the parables in the Gospel of Luke, which we shall be hearing at Sunday Mass as we continue through Year C of the lectionary.
