THE SEASON OF ADVENT

This weekend we begin the new Church year with the four-week season of Advent. The Roman Calendar says most explicitly: "Advent has a twofold character: as a season to prepare for Christmas when Christ's first coming to us is remembered; as a season when that remembrance directs the mind and heart to await Christ's Second Coming at the end of time."

The Christian word "advent" (adventus) is not of Christian origin: some pagan religions celebrated annually the manifestation of the divinity that came to dwell in its temple at a particular time of year; that feast was called *adventus*. Often a statue of the divinity was placed in the temple sanctuary – when it literally returned to its temple. The shift in meaning came with the institution of the season of Christmas-Epiphany; Christians celebrate the coming of the Son of God in the temple of his flesh and his return, when all is concluded. In this season, we are given the time and space to wait in 'joyful hope for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ'.

THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR THIS WEEK ...

Wednesday is the **Feast of Saint Andrew** – it was Andrew who introduced his brother Simon (Peter) to the Lord. Eventually, with James and John, they left all to follow Jesus. Andrew is patron saint of Russia and Scotland.

Thursday is the **Diocesan Memorial of Blessed John Beche** – he became abbot of Colchester St John's in 1535 and refused to surrender his abbey to the King. His private remarks showing his disgust at the government's religious policy were enough for him to be arrested and executed at Colchester.
