UKRAINIAN EMERGENCY WINTER APPEAL

Ukrainians remain resilient despite the circumstances of the war, but they are in the throes of a harsh winter. For that reason a new Emergency Winter Appeal has been launched to provide food packages for the most vulnerable on the frontlines and in recently liberated regions in East and South Ukraine which are suffering from a severe humanitarian crisis. The cost of one food parcel, providing enough food for two people for a week costs approximately £16. Each package contains the basics: grains, flour, pasta, meat and fish preserves, oil, canned vegetables, sugar, tea, coffee, biscuits, etc. It is hoped that £160,000 can be raised to allow the supply of 10,000 food parcels to those most in need.

The Appeal is being co-ordinated through the Ukrainian Catholic Cathedral in central London; if you would like to make a contribution, funds can be remitted to:

THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR THIS WEEK

Tuesday is the **Memorial of St Anthony** – a man of wisdom, holiness and understanding of human nature. Early in the fourth century he organised the very first monks, groups of men who, like himself, lived as hermits. He became known as the 'friend of God' and died in the year 356.

Wednesday marks the beginning of the **Week of Prayer for Christian Unity** – it concludes with the Feast of the Conversion of St Paul (25 January).

Thursday is the **Memorial of St Wulstan** – an Anglo-Saxon, he was born in 1008, became a priest and joined the Benedictines at Worcester. In 1062 he was ordained Bishop of Worcester and, because he had led his diocese so wisely, he was the only English bishop to retain his See following the Norman Conquest (all other bishops being replaced by Frenchmen). He died whilst engaged in his daily practice of washing the feet of twelve poor men. He was canonised in 1203.

Friday is the **Memorial of St Sebastian** – one of the most popular saints in the first centuries of the Church; a favourite army officer of the Emperor Diocletian until he was discovered to be a Christian. Then he was tied to a tree and used for archery practice and finally clubbed to death in about the year 288.

Pope Francis, *Angelus Address*, 19 January 2020

This second Sunday of Ordinary Time is in continuity with the Epiphany and the Feast of the Baptism of Jesus. The Gospel passage (cf. Jn 1: 29-34) again speaks to us of the manifestation of Jesus. Indeed, after being baptized in the River Jordan, He was consecrated by the Holy Spirit Who came upon Him, and was proclaimed Son of God by the voice of the heavenly Father (cf. Mt 3: 16-17 et seq.). The Evangelist John, unlike the other three, does not describe the event, but proposes to us the witness of John the Baptist. He was the first witness of Christ. God had called him and prepared him for this.

The Baptist cannot hold back the urgent desire to bear witness to Jesus and declares: "I have seen and have borne witness" (v. 34). John saw something shocking, that is, the beloved Son of God in solidarity with sinners; and the

Holy Spirit made him understand this unheard-of novelty, a true reversal. In fact, while in all religions it is man who offers and sacrifices something to God, in the event Jesus is God Who offers His Son for the salvation of humanity. John manifests his astonishment and his consent to this newness brought by Jesus, through a meaningful expression that we repeat each time in the Mass: "Behold the Lamb of God, Who takes away the sin of the world!" (v. 29).

The testimony of John the Baptist invites us to start out again and again on our journey of faith: to start afresh from Jesus Christ, the Lamb full of mercy that the Father gave for us. Let us be surprised once again by God's choice to be on our side, to show solidarity with us sinners, and to save the world from evil by taking it on fully.

Let us learn from John the Baptist not to assume that we already know Jesus, that we already know everything about Him (cf. v. 31). This is not so. Let us pause with the Gospel, perhaps even contemplating an icon of Christ, a "Holy face". Let us contemplate with our eyes and yet more with our hearts; and let us allow ourselves to be instructed by the Holy Spirit, Who tells us inside: It is He! He is the Son of God made lamb, immolated out of love. He alone has brought, He alone has suffered, He alone has atoned for sin, the sin of each one of us, the sin of the world, and also my sins. All of them. He brought them all upon Himself and took them away from us, so that we would finally be free, no longer slaves to evil. Yes, we are still poor sinners, but not slaves, no, not slaves: children, children of God!
