## THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR

Monday is the **Memorial of St Angela Merici** – founder, in 1535, of the Ursuline Sisters, the first teaching order of nuns. This was in the northern Italian town of Brescia, near where she had been born in 1474. She died in 1540.

Tuesday is the **Memorial of St Thomas Aquinas** – a Dominican priest and an outstanding Doctor of the Church. He was, first and foremost, a man of prayer. Composer of several hymns including the *O salutaris* and *Tantum ergo*. His writing, principally the magisterial *Summa Theologiae*, formed the basic text used in the formation of priests and is still influential today.

Friday is the **Memorial of St John Bosco** – founder of the Salesian Fathers and Brothers and co-founder of the Salesian Sisters. He had a deep understanding of young people and their problems. He died in 1888.
