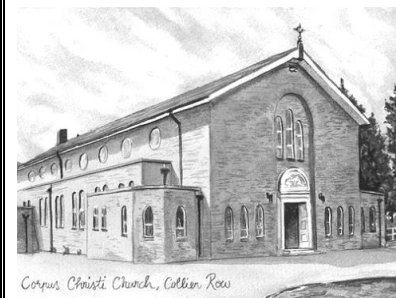

DURING LENT

The traditional 'disciplines' of Lent include prayer, fasting and almsgiving; some suggestions to help make Lent special:

- Try to create some time for quiet – for thought and prayer, for reflecting on the Word of God (take away the readings sheet to help with this).
- Pay a visit to the church – it is open daily for peace and quiet, for prayer and contemplation.
- Come to a weekday Mass at 9.00 am or to Morning Prayer at 8.45 am or take part in the Way of the Cross on Fridays at 7.30 pm.
- Give an appropriate amount to a charity of your choice, or support "Mary's Meals" - our Lenten Offerings Appeal. Providing nutritious meals for children in places of learning in some of the poorest parts of the world; further information about this charity is available in the porch. The basket will be at the back of the church throughout Lent.

CAFOD LENT FAST DAY

Last Friday was the CAFOD Lent Fast Day – we were asked to fast in solidarity with the world's poor; the money saved forms the second collection this weekend which provides valuable support for our own Catholic aid agency.

PARISH OFFERINGS

Last weekend the Parish Offerings amounted to £958.71 (£432.60 of this was gift-aided). The collection for Survive MIVA came to £395.81 (£70.00 gift-aided) and Mary's Meals £137.11. As always, we thank you for your generous and continued giving.
