from the Angelus Address, Pope Benedict XVI, Papal Residence at Castel Gandolfo, 26 Sept 2010

In this Sunday's Gospel (Lk 16: 19-31), Jesus tells the Parable of the rich man and poor Lazarus. The former lives in luxury and egoism and when he dies, he will go to hell. The poor man on the contrary eats the food left over from the table of the rich man, and at his death he will be brought by angels to his eternal dwelling place with God and the saints. "Blessed are you poor", the Lord proclaimed to his disciples, "for yours is the Kingdom of God" (Lk 6: 20). But the message of the parable goes further. It reminds us that while we are in this world we should listen to the Lord who speaks through the Sacred Scriptures and to live according to his will, otherwise after death it will be too late to repent. This parable teaches us two lessons: the first is that God loves the poor and comforts their humiliation; the second is that our eternal destiny is conditioned by our attitude, it is up to us to follow the path that God has laid out for us in order to attain life and this path is love, not intended as a feeling but as service to others in the charity of Christ.

By a happy coincidence, [yesterday we celebrated the Liturgical Memorial of St Vincent de Paul, Patron of Catholic charities] . . . In 16th-century France, he himself keenly perceived the strong contrast between the richest and the poorest of people. In fact, as a priest, he had the opportunity to experience the aristocratic life and life in the country, as well as the dregs of society in Paris. Encouraged by the love of Christ, Vincent de Paul knew how to organise permanent forms of service for marginalized people, giving life to the so-called "*Charitées*" and "*Charities*", that is the groups of women who gave their time and belongings to the most marginalized people. Some of these volunteers chose to consecrate themselves completely to God and to the poor, with St Louise de Marillac, and St Vincent, Founder of the "Daughters of Charity" the first female congregation to live a consecrated life "in the world", with the common people, including the sick and the needy.

Quotes from St Carlo Acutis on the Eucharist

- The Eucharist is the highway to heaven.
- The more Eucharist we receive, the more we will become like Jesus, so that on earth we will have a foretaste of heaven.
- By standing before the Eucharistic Christ, we become holy.
- \cdot When we face the sun we get a tan... but when we stand before Jesus in the Eucharist we become saints.
- St Carlo Acutis is one of the Church's newest saints a fifteen year old Italian boy who was canonised by Pope Leo recently.

THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR THIS WEEK . . .

Monday is the **Feast of SS Michael, Gabriel & Raphael, archangels** — each of these archangels plays an important part in sacred scripture and in the life of the Church. Their names are Hebrew: Michael meaning 'Who is like God?', Gabriel — 'Strength of God' and Raphael — 'The Healing of God'.

Tuesday is the **Memorial of St Jerome, priest and teacher of the faith** – one of the Church's greatest scholars, he was the first to complete a translation of the Bible from Hebrew and Greek into Latin – by then the common (vulgar) language of the people – hence the name 'Vulgate Bible' (for centuries the standard Latin version of the Bible used by the Church). He died at Bethlehem in 420.

Wednesday is the **Memorial of St Thérèse of Lisieux, religious and teacher of the faith** – she showed by her life as a Carmelite nun and by her writings how each of us can 'become like little children again' in God's sight. She died at Lisieux in 1897.

Thursday is the **Memorial of the Holy Guardian Angels** – this day honours those angels appointed by God to look after our personal welfare.
