### MUSIC DURING HOLY COMMUNION

The traditional penitential chant *Attende Domine* for the Sundays of Lent; originally from the Mozarabic Breviary, its use was extended throughout the Western Church. The Mozarabic Rite was celebrated throughout the Iberian peninsular (Spain and Portugal) until it was replaced in the eleventh century by the Latin Rite, as used throughout much of the Catholic Church. The Mozarabic Rite is still used daily in the cathedral at Toledo.

*Attende Domine, et miserere, quia peccavimus tibi.*

*Give heed, O Lord, and have mercy, for we have sinned against you.*

The verses could be translated thus:

*To you, great King, Redeemer of all, we raise our eyes and weep; hear, O Christ, the suppliants' prayers.*

*O right hand of the Father, O corner-stone, O way of salvation, O gate of heaven,  
wash away the stains of our guilt.*

*We beseech, O God, your majesty; bend down your sacred ears to our sighs; gently forgive our great sins.*

*To you we confess and admit our crimes; with a contrite heart we reveal the hidden things;  
let your loving kindness, Redeemer, forgive.*

### THE SHROUD OF TURIN EXHIBITION

View a full-sized replica of the Shroud of Turin. Free admission. Wednesday 12 March – Monday 21 April at St George's Cathedral Lambeth Road Southwark SE1 7HY. St George's Cathedral is open Monday–Friday from 7:15am–5pm, Saturday from 9am–7pm, and Sunday from 7:30am–7pm. The Shroud of Turin is a length of linen cloth that bears a faint image of the front & back of a crucified man - believed by many to be the actual burial Shroud used to wrap the body of Our Lord after his crucifixion, & upon which his bodily image is miraculously imprinted.
