Thursday is the **Feast of St Andrew** – it was Andrew who introduced his brother Simon (Peter) to the Lord. Eventually, with James and John, they left all to follow Jesus. Andrew is patron saint of Russia and Scotland.

Friday is the **Diocesan Memorial of St John Beche** – he became abbot of Colchester St John's in 1535 and refused to surrender his abbey to the King. His private remarks showing his disgust at the government's religious policy were enough for him to be arrested and executed at Colchester.
