THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR THIS WEEK

Wednesday is the **Solemnity of the Dedication of the Church** – we recall the day in 1979 when our church was dedicated by Bishop Patrick Casey. We give thanks for this building, for those pioneers who had the inspiration and worked so hard to create it and for all who have built up the community that is the People of God, the Church, here at Corpus Christi.

In the Universal Calendar, Wednesday is also the **Memorial of Saint Nicholas** – according to tradition, a fourth century bishop in what is now Turkey. He is still popular in parts of Europe where children receive presents on his feastday. 'Santa Claus' is derived from a form of his name.

Thursday is the **Memorial of St Ambrose** – a fearless defender of the Faith, who became Bishop of Milan in the year 374 and was very much a pastor to his people. He had a great deal to do with the conversion of St Augustine of Hippo – one of the most influential theologians in the history of the Church.

Friday is the **Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary** – from the very first moments of her existence in the womb of St Anne, her mother, Our Lady was preserved from the state of Original Sin: she was 'full of grace'. Saint Pope Paul VI wrote that this feast, falling as it does early in Advent, is also the 'basic preparation for the coming of the Saviour, as well as the happy beginning of the Church, without spot or wrinkle'.
