

THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR THIS WEEK

Tuesday is the **Memorial of St Willibrord** – born in about 658 in the Kingdom of Northumbria, he was an Anglo-Saxon missionary, known as the "Apostle to the Frisians" in the modern Netherlands. He became the first bishop of Utrecht and died in 739 at Echternach, Luxembourg.

Thursday is the **Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica** – this ancient church, dedicated to St John the Baptist and St John the Evangelist, is the cathedral church of the Pope as Bishop of Rome. We give thanks for the building itself, which has stood as a witness to the Faith throughout the Christian centuries, and for the Holy See, focus of the unity of the Church, gathered around and in communion with, our Holy Father, Pope Francis.

Friday is the **Memorial of St Leo the Great** – in the face of heresy, this Pope was a champion of the doctrine that Jesus is both God and Man. He died in 461.
